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START HERE!

The **Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary)** requires the successful completion of 360 credit points (240cp for the Bachelor of Arts degree and 120cp from the Master of Teaching). Each unit of study at ACU equates to 10cp. Therefore students in this course will complete 36 units in total.

The discipline knowledge required to teach two secondary curriculum areas are gained through studies in the Bachelor of Arts. Students can choose one of four pathways:

- 2 Arts Majors (leading to 2 teaching areas)
- 1 Arts Major and 2 Arts Minors (leading to 3 teaching areas)
- 1 Arts Major, 1 Arts Minor and a Religious Education Minor (leading to 2 teaching areas plus RE as a 3rd)
- 1 Arts Major, 1 Arts Minor and 4 Arts Electives (leading to 2 teaching areas). *Arts elective units can be drawn from the disciplines listed below or from any other Arts Majors and Minors listed in the **2025 Arts Unit Listing (link to be attached)**. Student choosing this pathway must consult with the Course Coordinator.*

ARTS MAJORS AND MINORS

A **major** is a total of 80 credit points (cp) in prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10 cp at introductory level, at least 40cp at 200-level and at least 20cp from 300-level.

A **minor** is a total of 40cp from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10cp at introductory level and at least 20cp from 200/300-level.

Note: The National School of Arts also offers some Majors/minors as part of the Bachelor of Arts that either do not articulate to a secondary teaching area at ACU or are excluded from this course. Students undertaking the Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary) should not choose a major or minor study in any of the following areas:

Students may choose to study units from these areas as electives if their pathway allows for electives.

- MAJOR (First teaching area in Ancient History and Second teaching area in Modern History): Take at least five units of Ancient History and three units of Modern History. Include HIST106, HIST308 and one more 300-level Modern History unit.
- MAJOR+2 (First teaching area in Modern and Ancient History): Take ten units with at least five units of Ancient History and five units of Modern History. Include HIST106 and HIST308.
- MINOR+2 (Second teaching area in Modern and Ancient): Include at least three units of Modern History and three units of Ancient History.

Students who only want to teach Ancient or Modern (not both):

- MAJOR in Modern History: Take at least five units of Modern History. Include HIST106 and one unit of 300-level Modern History. In addition, you must also take HIST308 as well as two more units of History (two Ancient or two Modern or one of each).
- MAJOR in Ancient History: Take at least five units of Ancient History. In addition, you must also take HIST106, HIST308 and one more unit of 300-level Modern History.
- MINOR in Modern History: Take at least three units of Modern History and one unit of Ancient or Medieval History.
- MINOR in Ancient History: Take at least three units of Ancient History and one unit of Modern or Medieval History.
- MINOR+2 in Modern History: Take five units of Modern History, plus one unit of Ancient or Medieval History. Two of your units must be at 300-level for you to qualify for a first teaching area.
- MINOR+2 in Ancient History: Take four units of Ancient History plus HIST308, plus any 300-level Modern History unit for you to qualify for a first teaching area.

Note: HIST308 can be counted as either Modern or Ancient History unit. Due to the complexity of the various course rules in the BED (Secondary)/BA degrees in NSW, please contact your Course Coordinator if you have any questions regarding your Ancient or Modern History majors.
