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START HERE!

The **Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary)** requires the successful completion of 360 credit points (240cp for the Bachelor of Arts degree and 120cp from the Master of Teaching). Each unit of study at ACU equates to 10cp. Therefore students in this course will complete 36 units in total.

The discipline knowledge required to teach two secondary curriculum areas are gained through studies in the Bachelor of Arts. Students can choose one of four pathways:

- 2 Arts Majors (leading to 2 teaching areas)
- 1 Arts Major and 2 Arts Minors (leading to either 2 or 3 teaching areas)
- 1 Arts Major, 1 Arts Minor and a Religious Education Minor (leading to 2 teaching areas plus RE as a 3rd)
- 1 Arts Major, 1 Arts Minor and 4 Arts Electives (leading to 2 teaching areas). *Arts elective units can be drawn from the disciplines listed below or from any other Arts Majors and Minors listed in the **2026 Arts Unit Listing** (link to be inserted). Student choosing this pathway must consult with the Course Coordinator.*

ARTS MAJORS AND MINORS

A **major** is a total of 80 credit points (cp) in prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10 cp at introductory level, at least 40cp at 200-level and at least 20cp from 300-level.

A **minor** is a total of 40cp from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10cp at introductory level and at least 20cp from 200/300-level.

Note: The National School of Arts also offers some Majors/minors as part of the Bachelor of Arts that either do not articulate to a secondary teaching area at ACU or are excluded from this course. Students undertaking the Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary) should not choose a major or minor study in any of the following areas:

- Communication
- Creative Writing
- Design & Technology
- Graphic Design
- International Development Studies
- Media
- Philosophy
- Sociology
- Youth Work

Students may choose to study units from these areas as electives if their pathway allows for electives.

UNIT DELIVERY MODES

C - On Campus (was attendance)

HIST106 and HIST308 are core units in this major. HIST106 is core in the first year and HIST308 is a capstone unit in the third year. The major may include units from both Ancient and Modern History.

Important information for students in Victoria and Queensland: As well as the compulsory units listed above, students in Victoria and Queensland can take any combination of History units at the correct level.

Important information for those seeking to be a secondary History teacher in New South Wales:

Students who want to qualify to teach history in NSW need either a major or minor in History as part of their Bachelor of Arts. NESA also requires that you specialise in either Ancient or Modern History – in addition to completing one unit of the other specialty. This makes your course map more complicated than for other subject areas, particularly if you want to qualify to teach both Ancient and Modern History. Please follow the advice below and contact your course coordinator for assistance in mapping your course.

The compulsory unit HIST308 may count toward either Ancient or Modern History.

Ancient History:

If completing a major, the compulsory unit HIST106 meets the one unit of Modern History requirement, so all remaining units (70CP) should be drawn from Ancient History units only. If completing a minor, select one unit of Modern or Medieval History and the remaining units (30CP) from Ancient History.

Modern History:

In a major or a minor, select one unit of Ancient or Medieval History (it's recommended that this is a 100 or 200 level unit). The remaining units in your sequence should all be drawn from Modern History.

Qualifying to Teach both Ancient and Modern History:

In order to teach both histories, you will need to take the 'One Major, One Minor and Electives' course map. You will use your Major and your Electives to complete the required History units. You will also need to complete another subject area (e.g. Geography, English, etc) as a minor. This is a complex course map, so it is recommended that you reach out to your course coordinator early in your degree for assistance in mapping your units.

NB: It is not possible to qualify to teach both Ancient History, Modern History, AND Religious Education in this degree.
