

Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching (Secondary)

How to enrol for the first time

Course Overview

This is the double degree program that provides benefits in the range of areas you can study, the expertise and mastery you can gain in each area and the fact that you will study a Masters degree in teaching within the double degree structure.

For the first three years you will study mainly Arts units with a small number of teaching units, and from third year onwards will focus more intensively on teaching units.

The Arts majors and minors provide you with the content, knowledge and skills for your discipline areas. The teaching units teach you how to teach in those areas. Both are vital for secondary teaching.

This course is 4 years long or up to 8 years part-time.

The first step in enrolling

Decide which areas you would like to teach in your future career. Look at the 'Majors and Minors' document in the Course Enrolment Guide.

You may choose:

• Option 1: **Two majors** to study throughout your degree — these will become your teaching areas

OR

- Option 2.1: **One major and two minors** your major and one minor will become your teaching areas.
- Option 2.2: One major and two minors (all three as teaching areas)
- Option 2.3: One major, one minor and Religious Education (all three as teaching areas).

OR

Option 3: One major, one minor and four electives — your major and minor will become
your teaching areas.



The second step in enrolling: find the correct map for you




Sample 1: Annotated sample map, two majors




Sample 2: Annotated sample map, one major and two minors

The third step in enrolling: find and choose your units (subjects)

You will see a list of units available for each major/minor. For example:



HINT 1: All your units in first year should be 100-level units (i.e. begin with a 1) except for those students completing two majors, who will take one 200-level unit in their second semester of first year.

Understanding the unit list:

You should select units that are listed for your campus or are available online.

C = On Campus Your classes will be delivered at a scheduled time, on campus or approved

ACU delivery site, to enable in- person interactions.

M = Multimode Your classes may be a mix of recorded or online lectures and live classes

either on campus or via Zoom.

OS = Online Scheduled Your classes will be online live via Zoom

OU = Online Unscheduled You will not have live classes for this unit

Note: Students from any campus may enrol in an OS or OU unit.

PRE = prerequisite You may only study this unit if you have passed the listed pre-requisite unit. INC

= Incompatible You may not study the unit if you have passed the listed incompatible unit.

The fourth step in enrolling:

Don't just enrol for one semester, enrol for all required terms and semesters via Student Connect

If you are starting your degree in February (Semester 1), enrol in all of the required units for Semester 1, Winter Term and Semester 2.

If you are starting your degree in August (Semester 2), enrol for Semester 2 only.

Hint: If you email your course coordinator, always tell them what year you are in, the name of your degree (BA/MTeach), and your campus. (e.g. I am a first-year student in the BA/MTeach in Melbourne).



The fifth step in enrolling (if relevant):

Recognition of prior learning

If you have studied at another university or have transferred from another course at ACU with relevant units and have not already applied for credit/recognition of prior learning, you can do so online:

Credit and Recognition of prior learning

If you wish to study overseas or take another short international study option as an Arts elective

Variations on these 'typical' program models may be necessary for students who wish to study overseas. Students who would like to explore variations rather than one of the typical models should consult their course advisor to ensure that they will meet the requirements for course completion and teacher registration.

Possible options to discuss might be to take a short international study unit as a BA elective in Summer or during the second semester of your second year (You would likely need to rearrange your units with course coordinator approval to do this). If the units on offer are relevant to your major or minor, you may count the unit that way. However not all majors or minors will have an overseas unit

Arts Foundation Units:

You may hear from first-year students in the stand-alone Bachelor of Arts degree (without the Master of Teaching) that they are enrolling in first year 'Foundation' Units.

- These units do **not** apply to students in the Bachelor of Arts/Master of Teaching vertical degree.
- The Bachelor of Arts/Master of teaching degree is a separate course with its own course structure, map and course rules.
