

Information for Students who started their degree in 2020 or earlier

Refer to your Course Map

Your Course Map will show various units that should be studied in 2021. There are pages or documents available below for most types of units to provide information and advise which units relate to your two teaching areas.

Placement Units (EDFX coded)

Students will undertake placement units from their second year onwards. Placement Units are Core Units that involve placement in a school setting. Information about placements including additional requirements and dates can be viewed at the [Professional Experience Information Page](#)

Education Core Units (EDFD coded)

Students entering their second and fourth year have Education Core units. These units must be studied in the semester shown in the Course Map to ensure you study the correct units in sequence

Education Elective

Students entering their fourth year have one Education Elective to select. This can be chosen from the list of [2021 Education Electives](#)

Curriculum, Pedagogy and Assessment (CPA) Units

Students entering their third year will study two CPA units for each of their teaching areas. These CPA units are subjects that explore how to apply your knowledge in your Major and Minor to a school setting. You can find which CPA units relate to your teaching areas at the [Curriculum, Pedagogy and Assessment Unit](#) document.

Arts Major or Arts Minor Units

These units relate to the two teaching areas you decided on in your first year of study. Note in the Course Map which level unit you should be studying for each Major/Minor unit (100-level, 200-level or 300-level). Refer to the [2021 Arts Unit Listing](#) to select your Arts Major and Arts Minor units that correspond to the required level.

Arts Advanced Units to extend major or minor or Arts Elective

Students entering their second or third year have two Arts electives that can be used to extend their major or minor or as an elective.

In some cases, you are required to extend your major or minor. A summary of these mandatory extensions is provided below.

If the below tables do not list your minor as needing to be extended, select any Arts Elective instead
