

# Majors, minors, and Teaching Areas Bachelor of Arts (Western Civilisation) / Master of Teaching (Secondary)

## Option A

- The Bachelor of Arts Major (which provides the related First Teaching Area) is one of: Archaeology, Drama, Economics, Geography, Environment and Society, History, Mathematics, Study of Religions or Visual Arts.
- The Second Teaching Area is English.
- In addition, students choose one elective unit (10cp) from the Bachelor of Arts; this may be another unit in their First or Second Teaching Area.

Major/First Teaching Area	Second Teaching Area
<b>Archaeology (Teaching Area = Ancient History):</b> Students complete 80cp Archaeology major as their Arts major; students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements.	<b>English</b> Students meet the requirements of Second Teaching Area in English by completing: WLIT100, WLIT200, WLIT201 and WLIT300 as part of their core 140cp in Western Civilisation.
<b>Drama:</b> Students complete 80cp Drama major as their Arts major	As above
<b>Economics:</b> Students complete 80cp Economics major as their Arts major	As above
<b>Geography, Environment and Society (Teaching Area = Geography):</b> Students complete 80cp Geography, Environment and Society major as their Arts major	As above
<b>History (Teaching Area = Ancient or Modern History):</b> Students complete 80cp History major as their Arts major; students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements.	As above
<b>Mathematics:</b> Students complete 80cp Mathematics major as their Arts major; students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements.	As above
<b>Study of Religions:</b> Students complete 80cp Study of Religions major as their Arts major.	As above
<b>Visual Arts:</b> Students complete 80cp Visual Arts major as their Arts major.	As above

## Option B

- First Teaching Area is English (comprising 4x WLIT units and two BA English units taken as Arts electives)
- Bachelor of Arts minor (and related Teaching Area) is one of: Archaeology, Drama, Economics, Geography, Environment and Society, History, Mathematics, Study of Religions, Visual Arts; this is supplemented by 20cp x300-level units in the minor subject. This combination provides a **Second First Teaching Area**.
- In addition, students choose one elective unit (10cp) from the Bachelor of Arts; this may be another unit in their First or Second Teaching Area.

First Teaching Area	Additional First Teaching Area
<b>English</b> Students meet the requirements of First Teaching Area in English by completing:  WLIT100, WLIT200, WLIT201 and WLIT300 as part of their core 140cp in Western Civilisation. <b>PLUS</b> Two additional English units taken from the BA English sequence, including at least 10cp at 300level.	<b>Archaeology (Teaching Area = Ancient History)</b> Students complete 40cp Archaeology minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Archaeology, including HIST308 These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules. Students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements.
As above	<b>Drama</b> Students complete 40cp Drama minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Drama. These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules.
As above	<b>Economics</b> Students complete 40cp Economics minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Economics, These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules.
As above	<b>Geography, Environment and Society (Teaching Area = Geography)</b> Students complete a 40cp Geography, Environment and Society minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Geography, Environment and Society These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules.
As above	<b>History (Teaching Area = Ancient or Modern History)</b> Students complete a 40cp History minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in History These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules. Students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements for Modern or Ancient History.

First Teaching Area	Additional First Teaching Area
As above	<b>Mathematics</b> Students complete a 40cp Mathematics minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Mathematics. These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules. Students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements.
As above	<b>Study of Religions</b> Students complete a 40cp Study of Religions minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Study of Religions. These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules.
As above	<b>Visual Arts</b> Students complete a 40cp Visual Arts minor as their Arts minor PLUS 20cp 300-level units in Visual Arts. These 20cp are Arts Electives in the Course rules. Students will be guided in their choice of units to meet the NESA requirements for Visual Arts.

## Option C

Students also have the option of completing:

- a Second Teaching Area by completing their Arts 40cp minor
- an English First Teaching Area (60cp) (including 4x WLIT units)
- and then using additional Arts electives (30cp) as they choose. This might often be to complete further English units. Students must note that Visual Arts may not be taken as a Second Teaching Area in NSW.

May be taken as extra English or units to contribute to RE accreditation (following advice from the Course Coordinator).
