Progression Requirements Melbourne and Strathfield

You are required to follow the pattern of unit enrolment set out in your 2021 Course Enrolment Guide, unless otherwise approved by the Course Coordinator. In all aspects of progress through the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours), you will be advised by the Course Coordinator.

Please note that you need to adhere to the relevant progression requirements as outlined below:

Progression Requirements if you are enrolled in the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)

To progress to the third year of the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours), you must maintain a GPA of 5.50 on the ACU seven point scale in the first two years of this course. Students who do not meet this requirement will be transferred into the Bachelor of Psychological Science.

To be eligible to continue to the Honours year i.e. the fourth year of this course, you must maintain a grade point average of at least 5.50 on the ACU seven point scale in the third year of this course. In addition, you will be required to achieve at least four (4) Distinctions in the psychology units undertaken in the second and third year of the program.

Students who do not meet these requirements will be transferred into the Bachelor of Psychological Science.

Progression Requirements if you are <u>transferring</u> from the Bachelor of Psychological Science to the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours)

If you are enrolled in the Bachelor of Psychological Science and have a GPA of 5.50 on the ACU seven point scale at the end of your second year, you may be eligible to transfer into the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours).

If you transfer to the Bachelor of Psychology (Honours) you must then maintain your GPA of 5.50 on the ACU seven point scale in your third year in order to be eligible to continue to the Honours year. In addition, you will be required to achieve at least four (4) Distinctions in the psychology units undertaken in the second and third year of the program.

Students who do not meet these requirements – but meet all requirements for completion of the Bachelor of Psychological Science – will exit with a Bachelor of Psychological Science.
