# 1. Selection of a Minor

## 1.1. Selection of a Study Area or Discipline (Commencing students only)

As part of your course, you need to complete a Minor. A Minor is a total of 4 units (40cp) from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area within one Study Area. Normally this will mean at least 10cp at an introductory level (i.e. XXXX1xx), at least 20cp at advanced level (i.e. XXXX2xx or XXXX3xx) and 10cp at any level.

The four Minor units can be selected from a wide range of study areas - other than Psychology - available at ACU. The Minors you can chose from are listed in Table 1 below. Should you require further advice on choosing an appropriate discipline for your Minor units, please contact your Course Coordinator.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Please note regarding 'Assumed Knowledge': Students in Victoria need to have completed Mathematical Methods Units 3 and 4 at Year 12 level and students in New South Wales need to have completed Mathematics (other than Mathematics General 2) at Year 12 level, if they want to study any mathematics major, minor or elective units.



### 1.2. Selection of Units

Once you have chosen a study area, you must select your Minor units.

Your four Minor units must include at least one 10cp unit on the 100-level and at least two 10cp units at an advanced level (200- or 300- level units). Please note that you can only choose units whose pre-requisite requirements you fulfil. Pre-requisites are other units that you must have passed *before* enrolling in the unit and are listed under the unit name in the course map.

**Commencing** full-time students should select one Minor unit for Semester 1 2024 and one Minor unit for Semester 2 2024 in the study area they have chosen.

**Continuing** students should continue to complete Minor units consistent with the discipline they have chosen in the previous year; full-time students should select the third unit of the Minor for Semester 1 2024 and the fourth unit for Semester 2 2024.

## 2. Selection of Elective Units

In semester two of the <u>second or third year</u> of your studies there are two elective positions in your course. You may do:

- a) one psychology elective and one general elective, or
- b) two psychology electives.

You cannot do two general electives, as it is required that you complete at least one psychology elective (as per the Completion Requirements in the course rules).

### 2.1 General Elective

The General Elective Unit can be selected from any of the units included in the Arts unit listing (see the relevant list under the 'Unit Offerings' tab on your Course Enrolment Guide), or any of the minor units listed for Health Sciences in the table above, as long as it is available at your campus.

Please note that you can only choose a unit as your General Elective whose pre-requisite requirements you fulfil. Pre-requisites are other units that you must have passed *before* enrolling in the unit.
