

Planning your degree to lead to Honours in Law

Who is eligible?

• Admission to Honours is by invitation only for students who have completed 120 credit points of LAWS units with a Grade Point Average of 5.75 across all their LAWS units.

Why do Honours?

- An Honours degree allows academically strong students to pursue, through completing a
 thesis, a detailed study of an aspect of law in depth and to distinguish themselves in the
 competitive job market.
- Students build knowledge in their chosen area of study through research, analysis and communication skills.
- Undertaking Honours is also an important step for those who want to become an academic or a professional researcher.

How can I work towards undertaking Honours?

Students who are interested in Honours should:

- Aim to maintain a high GPA from the commencement of their Law studies.
- Follow their course map, as students will need to complete specified Honours units instead of the Law Electives in the course map of their penultimate and final years.
