

Arts Unit Listing 2020

Students must ensure that they select Majors and Minors that are approved for their degree, as not all sequences can be taken in every course. Some degrees may only allow certain majors or minors, we have attempted to include that information, but please consult your course rules or CEG for information for your degree.

- A Major is a total of 80cp from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10cp at introductory level, at least 60cp at advanced (200/300) level with at least 20cp from 300 level units.
- A Minor is a total of 40cp from prescribed units in one discipline or approved interdisciplinary area, normally including at least 10cp at introductory level and at least 20cp at advanced level.
- **Elective** is an individual unit undertaken other than those required for the selected majors or minors. You should consult your course rules or CEG to see what units are eligible for your degree. Always make sure that you have the prerequisites.
- A unit identified as a **cross-listed unit** may only be used in one major or minor or as an elective. You may not count the unit twice. (For example HUMA250 is listed as a Drama unit or a History unit. You need to determine whether you want it to count as Drama or History as you may not count it as both.)

The lists that follow provide the information on the units offered on the different campuses (or online) in 2020. Please note that there may be other units available in your chosen Major or Minor, which do not appear in this list because they are not on offer in 2020. To view the complete structure of your Major or Minor, please refer to the Course Rule sequences for the BA.

Students who started their Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Creative Arts degrees prior to 2019 will need to include at least two program core units in their degree. The ones on offer in 2020 are listed at the end of the document.

Students following the accelerated program map for the Bachelor of Arts need to take units in summer and winter. While the map places Arts electives in summer and UNCC units and community engagement in winter, students may alter the order of units taken if applying for an overseas winter intensive unit in the year ahead. (Arts units available in summer 2019-2020 are GEOG101 and ENGL140 – GEOG101 may be used as part of the Geography Minor or as an elective. ENGL140 is only available as an elective and is not part of the English/Literature major or minor.)

Community engagement units available in 2020 in the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Creative Arts and Bachelor of Arts/Bachelor of Global Studies are listed after the lists of all the majors and minors.

How to use this document

Use the table of contents to locate your major or minor and check what units are on offer in 2020 either at your campus or online. Some majors have specified units that are core to the major – these will also be listed with the major and minor information. Check the instructions at the top of the page to ensure that you meet any specific requirements for your degree. First year students should enrol in units that have a 1 in the first number in their first semester. All students should check that they have the prerequisites before enrolling.

In some cases, the rules for students taking teaching degrees are different to those for the Bachelor of Arts, this is also indicated on the appropriate page.

Click on the discipline in the table of contents or the footer to get to your discipline. The list of majors and minors available on each campus is provided after the Table of Contents.

BUSINESS STUDIES MAJOR OR MINOR

Important information for all Business Studies students

Business Studies is offered as a major or minor on Brisbane, Melbourne and Strathfield campuses. Students on the Strathfield campus may need to go to North Sydney to undertake some subjects. NOTE that the maximum number of first year units you can study in the major or minor is two. The minor requires you to have at least two units at second year level, so you cannot study a mixture of all first-year units. The major requires you to have at least 6 units at advanced level with at least 2 of those at third year level. In order to achieve this, you may need to choose your units from two of the sub-disciplines (Accounting, Marketing, Management or HR Management) so that you will have the prerequisites for third year units. (Consult your course coordinator if you have any concerns.)

Special rules for Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Exercise Science

The different states have different requirements for teaching in the area of Business Studies.

BRISBANE:

Business Studies is available as a minor or major in Brisbane. The Business Studies minor is available in the Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Exercise Science.

Students taking Business Studies as a minor should include BUSN113 Managing people and organisations (previously MGMT100) in their units. They also need at least 2 units at second year level.

Students studying the major should do 4 units of Management/HR Management and 4 units of either Accounting or Marketing and make sure that they have at most 2 units at first year level and at least 2 at third year level.

STRATHFIELD:

A Business Studies minor is only available in the Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Arts (Visual Arts). Students must normally undertake 4 units of Economics and should extend that with BUSN113 Managing people and organisations (previously MGMT100) and BUSN104 Money Matters. See Economics for units available and consult your course coordinator if necessary.

VICTORIA:

Business Studies is only available as a major in the Bachelor of Teaching/Bachelor of Arts (Humanities). It is not available as a minor in the other teaching degrees.

Students studying the major should do 4 units of Management/HR Management and 4 units of either Accounting, Marketing or Economics and make sure that they have at most 2 units at first year level and at least 2 at third year level. (For Economics units, see the available units under Economics.)

Important information for students undertaking Creative Writing and Literature

Specified units in Creative Writing minor, WRIT201/ENGL208 and WRIT230/ENGL230 may be undertaken in the English/Literature major. Please see the English major for this information (link is in the footer.)

Students who want to do BOTH a Literature Major/Minor and a Creative Writing Minor will need four WRIT-coded units for their Creative Writing minor and 4 ENGL-coded units for their Literature Minor or 8 ENGL-coded units for their major.

DRAMA MAJOR OR MINOR

Important information for students studying Drama

The Drama major and minor are taught on Brisbane, Melbourne and Strathfield campuses.

Core units in the major for students starting in 2020: PERF102, PERF104 in first year and PERF319 Theatre Performance is a compulsory capstone unit in the third year of the major.

Core units for the major for students starting prior to 2020: PERF319 Theatre Performance is a compulsory capstone unit in the third year of the major.

The Drama major underwent a review in 2019 and some of the units have changed their titles. If you have already undertaken a unit with the specific code, then you may not study it again even if the title has changed. There are also new units or units that have been reviewed and changed codes and titles. If a unit is listed as INC (incompatible) then you may not study that unit if you have already passed the incompatible unit.

Important information for all students taking History

The history major and minor is available on Brisbane, Melbourne and Strathfield campuses.

HIST106 and HIST308 are core units in this major. HIST106 is core in the first year and HIST308 is a capstone unit in the third year. The major includes both ancient and modern history.

There was a history review undertaken in 2019 that is being implemented in 2020. This may mean that there are units whose titles have changed or new units on offer. Make sure that you do not study any units that are incompatible with previous versions that you have already completed. You may study the new units, if available, and at the right level (not more than two units at first year level, at least two units at third year level, with the compulsory units of HIST106 and HIST308).

Important information for all students studying Study of Religions

Students may undertake Study of Religions or Theology as majors or minors in the Arts degrees. Students may not study a major in one and a minor in the other but may study both as minors in the BA.

The Study of Religions includes a variety of different religions whereas Theological Studies includes the Christian religion only.

Brisbane: Visual Arts may be undertaken as a major or a minor in the BTeach/BA and BTeach/BExSc degrees.

Melbourne: Visual Arts may only be undertaken as a major in the BTeach/BA (Visual Arts) degree. It may not be taken as a minor in teaching degrees in Victoria.

Strathfield: From 2019, due to changes in NESA regulations, students must undertake a major or a minor+2 (minor with 2 units at third year level) to meet NESA Visual Arts requirements. Visual Arts will only be available as a major in the BTeach/BA (Visual Arts) or an extended minor of 6 units in other teaching degrees in Strathfield. Those who are currently undertaking Visual Arts as a minor in the BTBA in Strathfield may continue to do it as a minor but should extend it if possible. Minor + 2: ARTS109, ARTS112, ARTS238/ARTS241, ARTS236, ARTS331 and ARTS332. Major - see the BTBA (Visual Arts) course map to ensure that you do all the recommended units in the right order.
