All Points to Teaching (APTT) program offers a unique employment-based pathway to becoming a qualified secondary school teacher. The APTT program provides fully funded scholarships to complete either a Bachelor of Education (Secondary), a Bachelor of Education (Secondary and Special Education), or a Master of Teaching (Secondary) while working in selected schools across New South Wales and Queensland.

Whether you're a recent school leaver or already hold a degree, or you're looking for a career change, APTT will equip you with the expertise, resourcefulness, and creativity to be a secondary school teacher. You will gain the skills, in-depth knowledge and practical experience to be classroom ready - without leaving your community.

The APTT program has specifically been designed to provide enhanced support while you are in the program and when you transition into the teaching profession.

SCHOLARSHIP

APTT students will be granted a fully funded scholarship to complete the Bachelor of Education (Secondary), Bachelor of Education (Secondary) and Special Education), or the Master of Teaching (Secondary). PEER SUPPORT PODS

APTT uses an innovative cohort-based approach to create a supportive and collaborative environment by connecting participants early in the program. This key feature guides participants to, through and beyond the attainment of their degree. APTT provides targeted support and face-to-face sessions designed to build resilience at the individual, community, and school level.

You will be connected with peers in a special cohort in one of seven cluster hubs across New South Wales and Queensland, including:

- South East Queensland
- Rockhampton
- Townsville
- Forbes/Bathurst
- Paramatta
- Lake Macquarie
- South East NSW, Riverina and Tablelands

Providing innovative entry points and pathway programs into teacher education, students will be placed in cluster hub schools as paid paraprofessionals, teachers aides and support officers, helping cluster schools to 'grow their own' teachers from within their schools and communities.

WRAPAROUND BENEFITS

Through structured professional learning, masterclasses, workshops and badged micro-learning, APTT participants will receive advanced wraparound support, connecting learning to the school workplace within their own communities. Purpose-designed, these professional development opportunities aim to build student tenacity, enhance autonomy, classroom readiness, and effective practices to engage diverse learners from diverse backgrounds.

INTERNSHIP

Supervised professional experience placements are at the heart of APTT. Participants gain 'on the job' exposure, across different schools for a breadth of experience, deepening their teaching expertise, while helping to shape the future of young learners.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants will be assessed on academic eligibility, professional experience in education and community service. We encourage applications from:

- school administrative and support staff
- recent school leavers, or graduates
- career changers
- individuals from low SES backgrounds
- individuals from rural, regional or remote communities
- first in family to attend university
- First Nations people.
