#### **Intervention News**

We are currently conducting follow-up interviews. However, it is important that the intervention continues until we have done our interview with you, so any beneficial effects of the intervention for families are observed. This ensures that the interview captures the actual intervention practice.

## **Children's Study Update**

• The children's study is exploring how children in OOHC experience and make sense of contact with their birth parents. Twenty-two children and young people aged nine to fourteen participated in first round interviews focusing on their experiences of contact. Eighteen of these children then chose to participate in a follow-up interview, which looked at any changes in contact, as well as exploring perceptions of family and the impact children see their contact visits having on their lives both now and into the future. Data analysis is well underway and a final children's reference group is planned for later this year to involve participants in the process of shaping the key findings. Particular findings from the family mapping activity will be presented at the ACWA conference in August and we expect to be in a position to share detailed findings from the entire children's study around the beginning of next year. Our thanks go to the project partners and carers for their ongoing support and especially to the children and young people whose willingness to share their experiences and insights have made this project possible.

### Progress over the last few months

- We have complete baseline data from parents, carers and workers for 53 children. Baseline data continues to be analysed.
- Follow-up interviews have commenced and participation of carers and parents who took part in baseline interviews has been high. These interviews should be completed by the end of August.
- Follow-up interviews will be conducted with managers of the agencies to obtain perspectives on the intervention and how it could have been implemented differently.
- An article based on the review of contact interventions we did in 2014 has been accepted by *Child and Family Social Work*, and is now available online http://onlinelibrary.wiley.com/doi/10.1111/cfs.12301/full

## What we hope to achieve over the next few months...

- We are commencing and completing the follow-up interviews with children, parents, carers and staff.
- We plan to complete baseline data analysis and continue drafting articles reporting the baseline results.

## Reporting our study findings...

- The Webinar on Thursday 21 July, 1.30 3.00pm in Melbourne will report on baseline data analysed to date.
- Final workshops will be held in the ACT and Victoria early in 2017 to report on study findings and provide an opportunity for discussing their implications.
