ACU's Uni Step-Up is your chance to experience university life by studying two first-year units while you are in Year 11.

Get a head start on a degree and university study by completing two undergraduate university units alongside other Year 11 students during the winter and summer school holidays.

GET A HEAD START

Uni Step-Up is a great way to test out a subject area and develop your skills in academic writing and referencing. You'll learn to use university systems and support services to help you get ready for university life.

THERE IS NO COST

Uni Step-Up is HECS-free and there is no cost to participants. All tuition costs and resources are covered by ACU.

EARN UNIVERSITY CREDIT

The units delivered in Uni Step-Up are the same units delivered to first-year undergraduate students. This means that you will receive credit for your Uni Step-Up units if you continue to study in a related course at ACU.

PATHWAY TO FURTHER STUDY

Participants who successfully complete two units become eligible to receive an early entry offer to a related ACU course.

What can I study?

NURSING, MIDWIFERY AND PARAMEDICINE

When you pursue a career in nursing, midwifery and paramedicine, you'll provide care, comfort and support to those at their most vulnerable, and help to build healthier communities.

- Bachelor of Midwifery
- Bachelor of Paramedicine.

Dual degrees are also available.

How does Uni Step-Up run?


Uni Step-Up is delivered on campus at ACU during the winter and summer school holidays. Additional online support sessions are held to help you with assessment tasks and coursework.

Classes are taught by an ACU academic staff member on campus at ACU. You will also receive additional support from an allocated Uni Step-Up staff member in addition to support from current ACU student ambassadors.

When does Uni Step-Up run?

Classes for the first unit start in the winter school holidays in 2026. Classes for the second unit take place during the summer 2027 school holidays.

Each unit is taught over six-days with additional online support sessions held when you return to secondary school study.

WHO CAN APPLY FOR UNI STEP-UP?

To participate in Uni Step-Up, you must be in Year 11 and meet at least one of the following criteria:

- attend a widening participation partner school; *or*
- identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander; *or*
- live in a regional or remote area.

HOW TO APPLY

Applications are open until Friday 22 May 2026 unless all spaces are filled earlier. To apply, you'll need to upload a copy of your most recent school report and provide two short answer written responses.

<p>To be effective in the field of criminology, you will need to know, understand and be able to apply the fundamental concepts and theories of criminology. The unit uses case studies to introduce you to these concepts and theories, and to paint a picture of crime and crime trends in Australia.</p> <p>The unit is not just an abstract theory unit, but a window into the minds and behaviours of criminals, and the ways these behaviours are discovered, predicted, portrayed, prevented and punished.</p>		<p>Topics will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • fact and fiction in criminology and criminal justice • media framing of crime • psychological and social explanations of crime • institutional responses: criminal justice system and policy • First Nations justice. <p>Introduction to Criminology is the first unit you will study in Uni Step-Up criminology.</p>

<p>In this unit students will begin by charting the historical development of violence as phenomena, and as a concept. The unit helps students identify what violence is, describe it, and then to consider it more analytically and theoretically in its different forms.</p>		<p>Topics will include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • what is violence? • collective violence • young people and violence • gender and violence • intimate partner and family violence • responses to family violence • violence prevention. <p>Violent Crime and Society is the second unit you will study in Uni Step-Up criminology.</p>

WILL I BE ENROLLED AS A UNIVERSITY STUDENT?

Yes. We'll set you up with a university email account and access to ACU's online learning platforms. As an ACU student, you will have full access to support from our academic skills unit, library services and peer mentors.

CAN I APPLY IF I'M NOT ON AN ATAR PATHWAY?

Yes. You can participate if you are a current Year 11 student, and you are on a pathway to complete a recognised Year 12 certificate.

CAN I APPLY IF I'M AN INTERNATIONAL STUDENT?

WHAT TYPE OF ASSESSMENTS ARE INVOLVED?

University unit assessments vary and can include multiple choice quizzes, posters, short answer questions, essays and exams. You will be guided and supported through all your assessments during your study.

DO I NEED TO ATTEND EVERY DAY?

Your attendance at every session is required. Please check the dates to ensure your availability.

WHO WILL BE IN MY CLASSES?

You will be in a small class with other Year 11 students. The class size is kept small to ensure that you can get to know other students and receive close support from university staff and peer mentors.

WHAT DO I NEED BRING TO CLASS?

Learning resources are supplied for you as part of your participation in the program. Students are required to have access to a laptop to access online course materials.

WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND AND DON'T WANT TO CONTINUE?

It's okay to change your mind – this is part of the journey as you learn about your interests and goals for the future. Once you start the program, we'll be there to support you, but if you do change your mind, you can exit the program early.

HOW DOES UNI STEP-UP HELP ME TO GAIN ENTRY TO ACU?

By completing the Uni Step-Up program, you will be eligible to receive an early offer to study at ACU. You will need to pass two Uni Step-Up units to be eligible to receive an early offer. Full details on early offers and conditions will be communicated after you complete the program.

I AM NOT SURE IF I SHOULD APPLY?

Uni Step-Up offers you a unique opportunity to try out university study before completing your schooling. Talk with your teacher and parent/guardian about your readiness to take on this extra challenge.
