There is an exciting new Indigenous world where Indigenous children, youth, and communities are not just succeeding but triumphing. However, little is known about how to identify, measure, and emulate these successes more broadly. This address introduces the new positive psychology of Indigenous thriving and the reciprocal research partnership model of Indigenous thriving utilising a research framework founded upon positive psychology principles and holistic Indigenous Australian worldviews. This model prioritises the voices and agency of Indigenous people, proposes that research be conducted in partnership as opposed to research being imposed on Indigenous communities, and focuses on Indigenous Australian strengths as opposed to deficit approaches.

The public lecture is FREE and starts promptly at 6:00 pm. The lecture will run from 6:00pm to 6:50pm followed by audience questions and comments. Travelling to ACU North Sydney:

By Train - ACU Tenison Woods House is an easy walk from the North Sydney Station. To get there, walk through the Greenwood Plaza and up the escalators until you come out at the Miller Street and Pacific Highway intersection. From there continue up Pacific Highway and turn left on Charles Street then right into Napier Street.

By Bus - Many bus services to North Sydney stop at Blues Street; adjacent to the station, or on the Pacific Highway. We recommend that you use the Sydney Buses Trip Planner to plan your bus journey to the campus.
