In the early eleventh century, bishops across Europe embarked on a campaign to rid the church of the married priest. The Latin church emerged from this period of reform as a triumphantly single-sex hierarchy, but cathedral precincts and priestly residences had once thronged with clerical wives and families. This lecture seeks to recapture a history of these women, considering their importance to medieval communities and their impact on religious life.
