OVERVIEW

I am a midwife academic with a focus on understanding problems faced by midwives and maternity services. I am currently the Professor of Midwifery at Australian Catholic University in Melbourne, Australia and Adjunct Professor of Midwifery at Edith Cowan University in Perth, Australia. I have been a nurse since 1995 and a midwife since 2003, and I have worked full time in midwifery education and research since 2010. I have authored 58 published peer-reviewed journal articles and one textbook (two editions to date), and supervised 14 Higher Degree by Research (HDR) students to completion. My Scopus *h*-index (July 2022) is 15.

My recent research, teaching and leadership has focused on

- how expectant and new parents prepare for and experience childbirth and the early postpartum period,
- midwives' job satisfaction, emotional wellbeing and retention in the profession, and
- reducing the time it takes for midwifery and maternity care research and clinical guidelines to be translated into maternity care.

I have also conducted work on or with implications for rural and remote nursing, neonatal nursing, and intensive care nursing.
