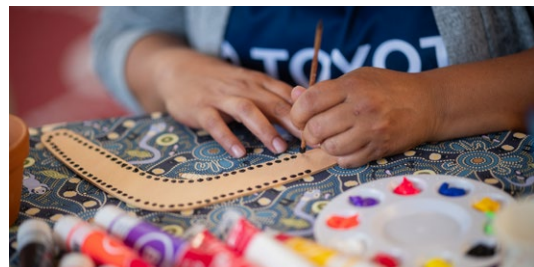

ACCESS AND DISABILITY SERVICE

ACU is committed to fostering an inclusive learning environment. If you have a disability, are neurodivergent, have a temporary or ongoing medical or mental health condition, or are a carer for someone who does, our team can support you throughout your studies.

STUDENT VETERAN SERVICES

Empowering Defence-connected students to lead successful and rewarding lives during and after military service is a mission-aligned priority for ACU. Registration pathways to becoming a psychologist

Our Bachelor of Psychological Science, Bachelor of Psychological Science (Honours) and our double psychology degrees are APAC-accredited Level 1 programs providing foundational competencies.

To obtain provisional registration as a psychologist, you must have completed a fourth year of study in

psychology and enrolled in a postgraduate psychology coursework program. At ACU, we offer a standalone fourth-year honours degree as well as a combined Level 1 and 2 Bachelor of Psychology (Honours).

Upon completing a Level 2 program, you have the option of applying for a fifth and sixth year of study, or a fifth year of study followed by a one-year internship of supervised practice.

You'll get to teach in a range of educational settings at different stages of your degree to ensure your practical experience evolves alongside your theoretical knowledge in education. Majoring/minoring in philosophy

Studying philosophy is a practical choice. Whether you choose to specialise in the area or take a few units as part of your professional degree, philosophy will broaden and enrich your studies, preparing you with skills to succeed across a variety of careers. You will sharpen your clarity of thought, be exposed to a broad range of ideas, and further develop qualities prized by employers, such as communication and critical thinking.

- The Bachelor of Theology/Bachelor of Philosophy allows you to immerse yourself in contemporary philosophy, its history and its deep connections with theology.

- The Bachelor of Philosophy/Bachelor of Laws allows you to complete your studies toward accredited legal practice while also completing a full philosophy major, including the philosophy of law.
- The Bachelor of Human Rights includes a sequence of philosophy units and other philosophy elective options.

There are also other ways to major or minor in philosophy. You can complete a philosophy major or minor in the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Psychological Science/Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Theology. You can complete a philosophy minor in the Bachelor of Psychological Science. Other courses also allow you to take one or more philosophy units.

Timetables, units and course maps

What will my timetable look like? How many units will I study? What are classes like at uni? Studying an undergraduate degree – eg a bachelor's degree – is very different to studying at high school. You won't be in class from 9am – 3pm five days a week, and the structure of courses and classes is also different.

Here is a quick rundown of a few key topics to help you understand what's involved when you study at university.

TIMETABLES

Timetables depend on the course you choose and if you decide to study full-time, part-time or in an accelerated mode. As a full-time student, you may be able to squeeze all your subjects into three days a week – but you also need to set aside time to read, research, review and complete assignments and exams.

Full-time uni schedules are typically designed so you have the flexibility to work part-time – so you can earn money, volunteer or pursue other passions while you study.

CLASSES

Classes are in different formats and may be held face-to-face, online or through a mix of the two. You'll usually have lectures (typically a large group of students with an academic presenting), tutorials (smaller group discussions with an academic) and workshops/practicums/placements (interactive experiences where you refine your skills). Practicums/placements often occur in real-world settings – for example, a business student may

complete an internship at a company, a nursing student will do a placement at a hospital, and an education student will do a placement at a school.

UNITS AND ASSESSMENT

Units are the subjects within your course. Each unit has a specified number of credit points that count towards your degree. Degrees will have core units that must be completed as part of the course, and electives that can be chosen from a selection of units for your course.

Each unit will also have its own assignments and exams, and each of these assessments will have a different percentage weighting towards your final result. For example, in one unit you may have a written assignment worth 40% of your final result, a multiple-choice exam worth 20% of your final result, and a group presentation worth 40% of your final result.

Assessments will vary for each unit you are studying and can include things like written reports, written essays, group presentations, individual oral presentations, in-class practical examinations/demonstrations, multiple-choice exams and quizzes.

Pathways to ACU

If you're worried that you won't get into your preferred university course, don't panic. That's why we have admission pathways.

They provide alternative options if you didn't get the selection rank you need, haven't completed Year 12, or don't meet some other requirement.

Pathways to an ACU degree

COMPLETE A PATHWAY DIPLOMA OR CERTIFICATE

If you haven't met the minimum ATAR for a course, lack the required prerequisites, or are making a significant transition into tertiary education, ACU's pathway courses can help.

By completing one of our pathway courses in a field similar to the degree you'd like to study at ACU, you may be able to apply for a Commonwealth supported place (CSP), and gain credit towards your ACU degree.

For example, our pathway diplomas offer a stepping stone into selected bachelor's programs. They provide strong support through small class sizes, personalised assistance and access to a wide range of student services. Upon successful completion, students can progress into various undergraduate degrees with credit for the first year of their chosen field, enabling direct entry into second year.

FOUNDATION STUDIES

The Foundation Studies Program is your pathway to an undergraduate degree at ACU if you don't have a recognised Year 12 qualification. The program builds your academic skills, confidence, and readiness for university study.

Whether you study online or on campus, you'll receive personalised support and all necessary resources – including textbooks, lab equipment, and access to ACU systems and facilities.

The curriculum covers English and academic skills, mathematics, science, humanities, law and business. You'll gain familiarity with university expectations and build meaningful connections within the ACU student community.

The program is offered as accelerated (one semester) or full (two semesters), depending on your prior education. Study options include on-campus (Blacktown or Melbourne), fully online, or a mix of both. Completion guarantees entry into most ACU undergraduate degrees, provided you meet the entry requirements.

NON-ATAR PATHWAYS

Your vocational education and training (VET) studies could offer a pathway into ACU. We recognise a range of VET qualifications, including certificate III, certificate IV, diplomas and advanced diplomas, which may provide entry to an undergraduate degree. If you're 21 years or older, your work and life experience can potentially be converted into a selection rank for entry into your chosen degree. Your rank will be based on criteria such as your skill level at work, and how long you have been in the role.

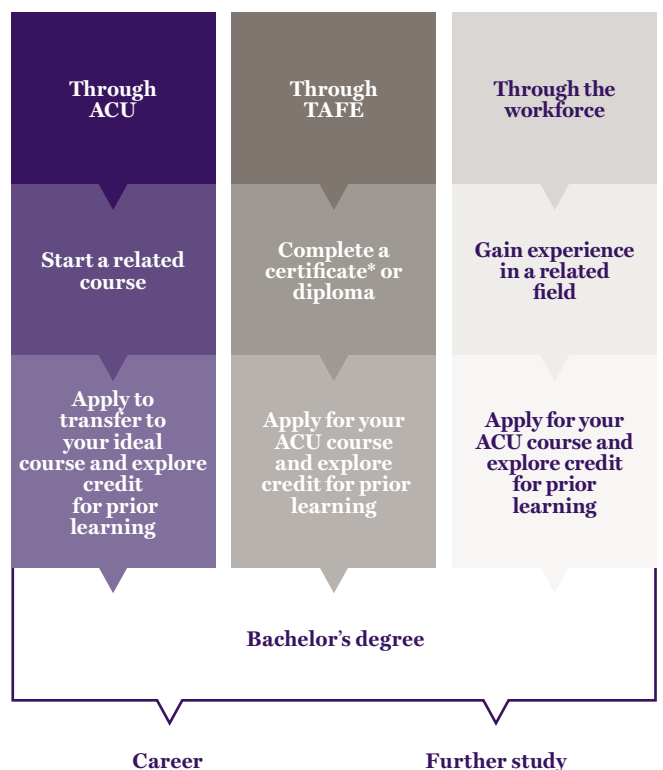

SKILLS FOR TERTIARY ADMISSIONS TEST

If you don't have a selection rank, or a recent academic history, you can still get into university. The Skills for Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) is a two-hour, multiple-choice aptitude test that allows applicants who are 21 years or older to demonstrate their potential for tertiary study.

VETERAN ENTRY PROGRAM

If you are a current or former member of the Australian Defence Force (ADF), you may be eligible for ACU's Veteran Entry Program (VEP). We'll assess your service in the ADF and convert it to a selection rank, so you can gain entry to an ACU program. You may also be eligible for credit towards your university degree through our recognition of prior learning program. Once you're an ACU student, our Student Veteran Support Program

(SVSP), as well as a range of other services offered by the Student Veteran Services team, will give you the tools and support you need to transition to student life and succeed. Spouses, partners and children of past and present ADF personnel can apply for the VEP family pathway in recognition of the sacrifices you have made to support your loved one's service.

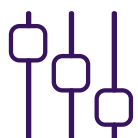


ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER ADMISSION PROCESS

As an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander, you may be eligible to apply for entry to ACU through our specialised admission process, which considers more than just your ATAR. This process involves meeting with a member of an Indigenous Higher Education Unit and a faculty representative to evaluate your potential based on your previous

studies, life experiences, and achievements. Most course applications are submitted through the relevant state Tertiary Admissions Centre (UAC, QTAC, or VTAC). For more information, please contact the Indigenous Higher Education Units.

MAXIMISING YOUR CHANCES

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEMES

If you have been unable to reach your full potential or had restricted access to the courses of your choice due to life experiences, such as financial

hardship, personal illness, home environment and responsibilities, education disruption and English language difficulties, you may be eligible for an educational access scheme. Applications for the Educational Access Scheme (Qld, NSW and ACT) and Equity Schemes and Scholarships (Vic) must be made directly to your Tertiary Admissions Centre. You can receive up to six points for the Educational Access Scheme. You can receive up to seven points for the Equity Schemes and Scholarships.

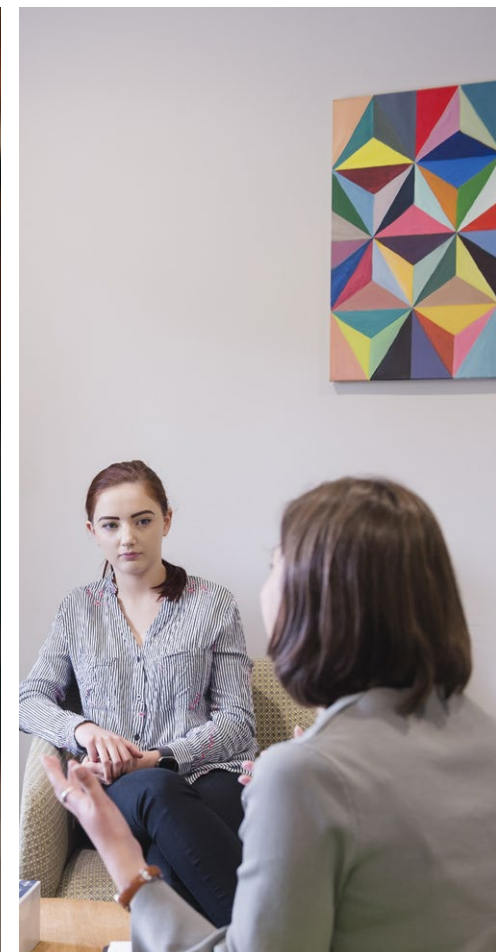

Scholarships

We believe that where you come from doesn't have to define where you're going. And while there are financial commitments that come with university study, this shouldn't stop you from pursuing your goals. That's why we offer around 1,000 scholarships each year to support you along the way.

TYPES OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Our scholarships range in value from \$1,000 to \$60,000, and are available to eligible students studying in every discipline across all of our campuses.

Our scholarships fall into two categories:

- Merit scholarships – awarded to students who have excelled in some area.
- Equity scholarships – provide support to students who are facing financial hardship or other disadvantages.

We also offer scholarships which can help with costs associated with student accommodation.

CREATING OPPORTUNITY FUND (COF) SCHOLARSHIPS

To create even more opportunities for our students, we’ve developed our COF scholarships. These scholarships aim to break down barriers to higher education by helping students experiencing financial hardship or other disadvantages reach their potential. Valued at \$4,000 each, they are designed to support you to achieve your goals, no matter what circumstances you may be facing.

APPLYING

It always pays to apply. You never know when you may be successful and scholarships can be a huge help. You’re welcome to apply for as many scholarships as you’re eligible for. Fees

Most Australian students will be studying in a Commonwealth supported place (CSP), where the Australian Government makes a contribution to the cost of your study, and you pay the ‘student contribution’.

Depending on the course, a CSP undergraduate student at ACU in 2026 pays between \$4,736 and \$17,392 per year of study. These fees may change for 2027.

Most Australian students pay their student contribution through the HECS-HELP scheme. This means the government lends you the money, and you start repaying the loan once your income gets above a certain amount. Alternatively, you can pay your student contribution upfront by the due date.

There are also a range of other loan schemes and government financial assistance available. For more information, visit studyassist.gov.au

GOVERNMENT AND OTHER FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

If you’re a domestic student enrolled in a nursing, midwifery, teaching or social work degree, you may be eligible for the Commonwealth Prac Payment (CPP) while you complete your mandatory placements. This support payment is designed to help you manage the costs associated with undertaking unpaid practical placements.

OTHER COSTS

As a student, you will also need to consider a range of expenses such as the student services and amenities fees, living costs, textbooks, computer equipment and uniforms (if applicable to your course).
