

DIGEST - ACADEMIC BOARD MEETING 06/2025, 12 November 2025

A summary of the Academic Board meeting 06/2025 held on 12 November 2025 is detailed below.

Welcome and Apologies

Academic Board extended a warm welcome to ACU Senators Marita Winters and Julian Widdup at the meeting.

Chair of Academic Board's Update

The Chair advised that the Academic Board Standing Orders will be revised to include guidance on the sharing of Academic Board papers.

Academic Board:

- noted the Academic Risk Register 2025.
- noted the results of the Academic Governance Maturity Self-Assessment Survey and accompanying thematic analysis.
- noted the annual member survey and provided advice on the annual report to the Senate.
- noted the 2026 Academic Work Plan.
- noted the approvals granted by the Chair of Academic Board.

Vice-Chancellor and President's (VCP) Update

The VCP provided an update on several key matters:

- the Final Report and Principles Expert Council on University Governance highlights the importance of greater Senate involvement in academic governance, particularly in matters of academic risk. The attendance of Ms Winters and Mr Widdup was seen as a positive step in this direction.
- the upcoming VC Staff Talks sessions will provide an excellent opportunity to reflect on the achievements of 2025 and to consider the challenges and opportunities ahead.
- the Provost has taken on the role of Chair of the newly established governance body, the Executive Leadership Forum (ELF), created to improve governance and collaboration across the university.
- discussion included the status of the Australian Tertiary Education Commission (ATEC).
- enrolments were reported as tracking above target, with particular emphasis on the significant growth in ACU Online.
- the contribution of the Provost's Portfolio to the Bachelor of Computer Science was acknowledged with recognition of the Academic Board's critical role in such decisions.

Academic Board noted the Report of the Vice-Chancellor and President.

Academic Board noted recent amendments to the ACU Al Action Plan from the Al Council as provided by the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Education) (DVCE).

Provost's Update

The Provost provided an update on several key matters:

- the introduction of Ministerial Direction 115, which replaces Ministerial Direction 111 from 14 November 2025, along with an overview of its three phase process.
- enrolments for 2026 have exceeded targets, however, numbers may plateau in 2027 due to caps on both international and domestic students. To address this, initiatives such as partnering with an Online Program Manager (OPM) and ACU's expansion into transnational education have been established.



Academic Board noted:

- 1. Expected end of year 2025 enrolment load for the university and individual areas.
- 2. The enrolment load outlook for 2026-2028 as well as international and domestic challenges.
- 3. Innovations related to the establishment of a partnership with an Online Program Manager (OPM) and ACU's entry into transnational education.
