SCHOLARSHIP

APTT students will be granted a fully funded scholarship to complete the Bachelor of Education (Secondary), Bachelor of Education (Secondary and Special Education), or the Master of Teaching (Secondary). PEER SUPPORT PODS

APTT uses a cohort-based approach to foster support and collaboration, connecting participants early to guide them to, through, and beyond their degree.

Cluster hubs:

Connect with peers in one of seven cluster hubs across NSW and Qld:

- Rockhampton
- South East Queensland
- Townsville
- Forbes/Bathurst
- Parramatta
- Lake Macquarie
- South East NSW, Riverina and Tablelands.

Students are placed in cluster hub schools as paid paraprofessionals, teacher aides and learning support officers, helping schools grow their own teachers from within their communities.

WHO CAN APPLY?

We encourage applications from:

- school administrative and support staff interested in becoming a teacher within their communities
- recent school leavers, or graduates, interested in teaching in an innovative, supported community-based model
- individuals looking for a career change
- individuals from low SES backgrounds
- individuals from rural, regional or remote communities
- first in family to attend university
- First Nations people.

ELIGIBILITY

- Citizenship: domestic.
- Study load: full-time.
- Course: must be commencing in one of the following:
 - o Bachelor of Education (Secondary)
 - o Bachelor of Education (Secondary and Special Education)
 - o Master of Teaching (Secondary).
- Teaching areas Bachelor's degrees: English, Maths, History and Geography.
- Teaching areas Master's degrees: (must be eligible for at least one of the following) English, Maths, History, Geography, Religious Education and/or Science.

Recipients must be able to commit to undertaking a placement within one of the seven cluster hubs.

Applicants will be assessed on academic eligibility, professional experience in education, and community service. Join us and shape the future of education.
