## Message from the Directors

The Nursing Research Institute (NRI) had an industrious year working on 29 projects and receiving six new grants totalling over \$10 million. In 2018, the NRI research team consisted of 14 core staff located across New South Wales, the Australian Capital Territory, Queensland and Victoria. NRI researchers were first or co-authors on 21 publications in high-impact journals and their work was presented at 21 national and international conferences, workshops and symposiums. These outputs reflect the continuing high quality and national and international significance of the NRI's research program.

The Director, supported by the Deputy Director, was invited to lead the Implementation Science component of the Implementation Science and Knowledge Translation platform of the newly formed collaborative Sydney Partnership for Health, Education, Research and Enterprise (SPHERE). SPHERE is one of nine Advanced Health Research and Translation Centres, accredited by the National Health and Medical Research Council, which bring together researchers, healthcare providers, education and training to improve the health and well-being of patients and the populations they serve. The Implementation Science component aims to increase the uptake of new knowledge, using evidence-based methods, to improve healthcare practice. This exciting and innovative initiative involves 14 clinical and academic partners, including the St Vincent's Hospital Sydney, to help co-design and implement strategies to change practice according to evidence-based guidelines.

We were fortunate to host an implementation science masterclass by esteemed scientist Professor Jeremy Grimshaw, and honoured with visits from scholars from ACU partner universities, Loyola University, USA, and the Hunan University of Traditional and Chinese Medicine, China. We were also delighted to host and mentor two exceptional undergraduate nurse scholars from the University of Miami, USA, as featured in this report.

Lastly, we would like to highlight the continued and outstanding support from our clinical partners. Without this we would not be able to conduct clinically relevant and innovative research. In recognition of their contribution, we congratulate the Directors of Nursing at St Vincent's Health Network Sydney, St Vincent's Private Hospital Sydney and Mater Hospital North Sydney, who were awarded honorary appointments by the ACU as Adjunct Professors. The title acknowledges their leadership in nursing and their contribution to the productive relationship with ACU for promoting and supporting NRI research initiatives.

Thank you again to our funders, collaborators and hospital partners for another productive year and we look forward to many more years of ongoing and productive partnerships.



### St Vincent's Clinic Medal

Professor Sandy Middleton was awarded the St Vincent's Clinic Medal at the St Vincent's Board Dinner on 21 November. The award was in recognition of Professor Middleton's outstanding contribution to mentorship and research. Professor Middleton was a member of the St Vincent's Clinic Board of Directors from 2011 to 2017. The Clinic's research foundation, St Vincent's Clinic Foundation, has supported a number of the NRI's evidence-based research projects, including the internationally renowned 'Quality in Acute Stroke Care (QASC) trial' and the current 'Use of Fascia Iliaca Blocks in elderly patients with a fractured neck of femur'.



### QASC Europe Angels Initiative EFPIA Service Delivery Award

The Quality in Acute Stroke Care Europe Angels Initiative won the 2018 Service Delivery Award from the European Federation of Pharmaceutical Industries and Associations (EFPIA). The EFPIA held its annual health collaborative awards on 22 November to recognise collaborative projects that have demonstrated benefits for patients across Europe. More than 80 European projects were considered for awards in 2018.

The Angels Initiative, launched by Boehringer Ingelheim, in partnership with the European Stroke Organisation, the World Stroke Organization and the Stroke Alliance for Europe, aims to improve acute stroke care in more than 300 hospitals in 12 countries across Europe. The Angels' mission is to increase the number of patients treated in stroke-ready hospitals. The NRI has partnered with the Angels in the QASC Europe project to assist in implementing the Fever, Sugar, Swallow clinical protocols in stroke units in these hospitals and in leading the evaluation stage, which aims to optimise the quality of treatment in all existing stroke centres.



### NHMRC Health Translation Advisory Committee

Professor Sandy Middleton has accepted a three-year ministerial appointment (2019–2021) as a member of the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) Health Translation Advisory Committee (HTAC). This follows on from her three-year ministerial appointment on the NHMRC Research Committee. The role of HTAC is to provide advice to the NHMRC Council and CEO on strategies to strengthen translational research and how to promote effective translation of research into practice and policy.

### Masterclass 2018 by Professor Jeremy Grimshaw

Professor Grimshaw is a leading authority in knowledge translation research. He is a Senior Scientist for the Clinical Epidemiology Program at Ottawa Hospital Research Institute, a Professor in the Department of Medicine, University of Ottawa, and a Tier 1 Canada Research Chair in Health Knowledge Transfer and Uptake.

### University of Miami Research Student Program

In June, the NRI welcomed two undergraduate nursing students from the University of Miami (UM) as part of the UM-ACU undergraduate research experience program. The students were selected into the UM's Minority Health and Health Disparities International Research Training Program, which is funded by the US National Health Institute. This program is designed to give students research experience in another country. Mr Antonio Sanchez-Gonzalez and Ms Sabrina Smith worked with Dr Oyebola Fasugba and Dr Cintia Martinez-Garduno to undertake a literature review on the 'Use of postal surveys in research assessing quality of life in stroke patients and their caregivers' and on the 'Quality of life of stroke patients', respectively. The students also demonstrated their competency in data analysis by completing a small research project looking at caregivers' burden and stroke survivor self-efficacy. At the conclusion of the seven-week program, they presented their results in a research poster to the NRI team and to their peers on their return to the UM.



### St Vincent's Campus Research Week

The NRI participated in the annual St Vincent's Research Campus Sydney Research Week, 10–14 September. NRI staff showcased our research through an education booth, posters and presentations. Ms Simeon Dale, Clinical Research Fellow at the NRI, was a member of a panel discussing research careers with high school students. ### Sydney Partnership for Health, Education, Research and Enterprise (SPHERE) Implementation Science Platform

Professor Sandy Middleton, supported by Professor Elizabeth McInnes, was invited to lead the Implementation Science component of the Implementation Science and Knowledge Translation platform of the newly formed collaborative Sydney Partnership for Health, Education, Research and Enterprise (SPHERE). SPHERE is one of nine accredited NHMRC Advanced Health Research and Translation Centres, which bring together researchers, healthcare providers, education and training to improve the health and well-being of patients and the populations they serve. SPHERE and St Vincent's Health Australia have funded a 12-month secondment for a Clinical Nurse Consultant (CNC) in Implementation Research to work collaboratively with the NRI and the Director of Nursing at St Vincent's Health Network Sydney.

### Visits to Mobile Stroke Units Memphis, Tennessee, USA & Royal Melbourne Hospital, Melbourne

As part of a research study program, Professor Middleton spent time observing and working on two mobile stroke units (MSU), one operated by the University of Tennessee Health Science Center in Memphis, USA, and the second operated by the Royal Melbourne Hospital. Both MSUs have on-board CT scanners capable of imaging the patient's brain in the back of the ambulance. This allows rapid detection of the type of stroke being experienced and, where applicable, prompt commencement of the clot-busting medication prior to transport to hospital. Both visits enabled Professor Middleton to gain a detailed understanding of a nurse's role in the MSU team in both an international and national context.

### In Memoriam



### Mr Paul Morgan RN, BA Grad Dip (Bus Admin) MEdPA

#### 4 March 1962 - 18 October 2018

The NRI was saddened by the loss of our highly regarded and dedicated colleague, Mr Paul Morgan. Paul devoted his life to caring for others. After many years nursing, he joined the Mater Hospital North Sydney (MHNS) as a clinical data analyst within the Mater Quality Improvement Unit. Paul developed an interest in blood and transfusion practice during his time as secretary of the MHNS Blood Transfusion Committee. After successfully applying for a Friends of Mater research grant, Paul undertook a research secondment with the NRI from 2016 to 2018 to research the implementation of a blood management program in the orthopaedic unit at MHNS. His hard work and dedication resulted in a peer-reviewed publication in the *Journal of Blood Medicine*, which was published in November 2018. After a long illness, Paul passed away in October 2018.




Figure 1: NRI grant funds awarded: 2009-2018




Figure 2: Number of NRI peer-reviewed publications – 2009–2018


